
WILLIAM E. ARSCOTT ART SCHOLARSHIP

The SFA Friends of the Visual Arts Board (FVA) will award one \$1,000 scholarship annually in the name of William Arscott to one SFA School of Art student to aid them in furthering their educational and professional goals in the field of art. Professor Arscott is the senior member of the art faculty and has worked in many artistic fields including painting, ceramics, print making, sculpture, and cinematography. In 1980 he established the cinematography program for the School of Art. Distinguished as both an artist and educator, Professor Arscott has been recognized and awarded many honors, including Texas Senate Resolution No. 514, Outstanding Educator of America, Alumni Distinguished Professor, and Regents Professor.

OBJECTIVES OF THE WILLIAM ARSCOTT ART SCHOLARSHIP:

To support the educational goals of students currently enrolled in the SFA School of Art by providing financial assistance to outstanding students in the visual arts program at SFA.

To honor the legacy of Professor Arscott as a teacher, as an ardent supporter of the arts in this community, and as a supporter of the FVA Board's mission.

CRITERIA FOR ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible to receive this scholarship, students must:

- Be a current SFA student working toward an art degree with a major area of studying in filmmaking.
- Maintain a 3.0 grade average.
- Be willing to donate a piece of art to at least one fundraising event sponsored by the FVA.

PROCESS

SUBMISSION PROCEDURES

SFA Faculty must nominate a student by a letter of recommendation that will go to the FVA Scholarship committee for review and approval. The nomination should be discussed in a faculty meeting during January for approval by all faculty members prior to submittal of the letter to the FVA scholarship committee by March 15th.

DECISION PROCESS

The SFA Faculty will review all nominations and make their recommendation to the FVA Scholarship committee, who will then approve the nomination. After a nominee has been approved to receive the scholarship, he/she must apply for a scholarship through the regular School of Art application process.

All monies provided through these grants will be awarded based on merit, correct completion of required documentation, and timely submission of requests.

The final decision for allocation of funds is solely at the discretion of the SFA Friends of the Visual Arts Scholarship Committee. The name of the recipient of this scholarship will be announced in April during the Art Alliance show when all the other School of Art scholarships are announced.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION:

The application packet should include the student details as shown below along with the Faculty Nomination letter. The letter should describe how the student meets the criteria required for this scholarship as well as identify any other outstanding qualities of the student that would justify the award of the scholarship.
